URGENT PETITION Vulnerable People at Risk from Assisted Suicide

Care Not Killing (CNK) has launched a PETITION calling on MPs to reject proposals for an assisted suicide law in England and Wales.

Labour leader, Sir Keir Starmer, has promised to give an assisted suicide bill government time The law could change quickly - possibly within a year - unless the public opposes such a move.

If assisted suicide becomes law in England & Wales:

- Palliative care provision will be undermined
- Suicide prevention programmes will be impaired
- Vulnerable people—including the elderly and disabled—will feel a burden and pressure to take their own lives*

(*In Canada, from 2017-2021, the MAJORITY of those opting for assisted suicide did so for fear of being a burden on their families, friends and carers. Only 1-in-3 people dying by assisted suicide did so owing to pain or fear of future pain)

The current law is the best safeguard

The state ought to provide care for those at the end of life, not deliberate killing.

So-called "safeguards" to prevent abuse of vulnerable people will prove futile.
