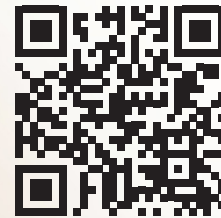
**On 11 September,

Three ways to make a difference

Urge your MP to vote NO - every interaction counts



1

EMAIL (quickest)

If you're short on time, sending an email only takes a few minutes. Every email is counted, and MPs notice when large numbers of constituents contact them about an issue.

2

WRITE A LETTER (more personal)

A handwritten or personal letter shows you've taken time to think about the issue. Letters often have greater impact because they stand out. Send your letter to: [MP Name] MP, House of Commons, London, SW1A 0AA

3

ARRANGE A MEETING (most influential)

A respectful conversation—especially if you can share your own experience or explain how assisted suicide could affect someone you know—is often what MPs remember when they enter the voting lobby.

Whether you send an email, write a letter or meet your MP in person, your voice matters.
